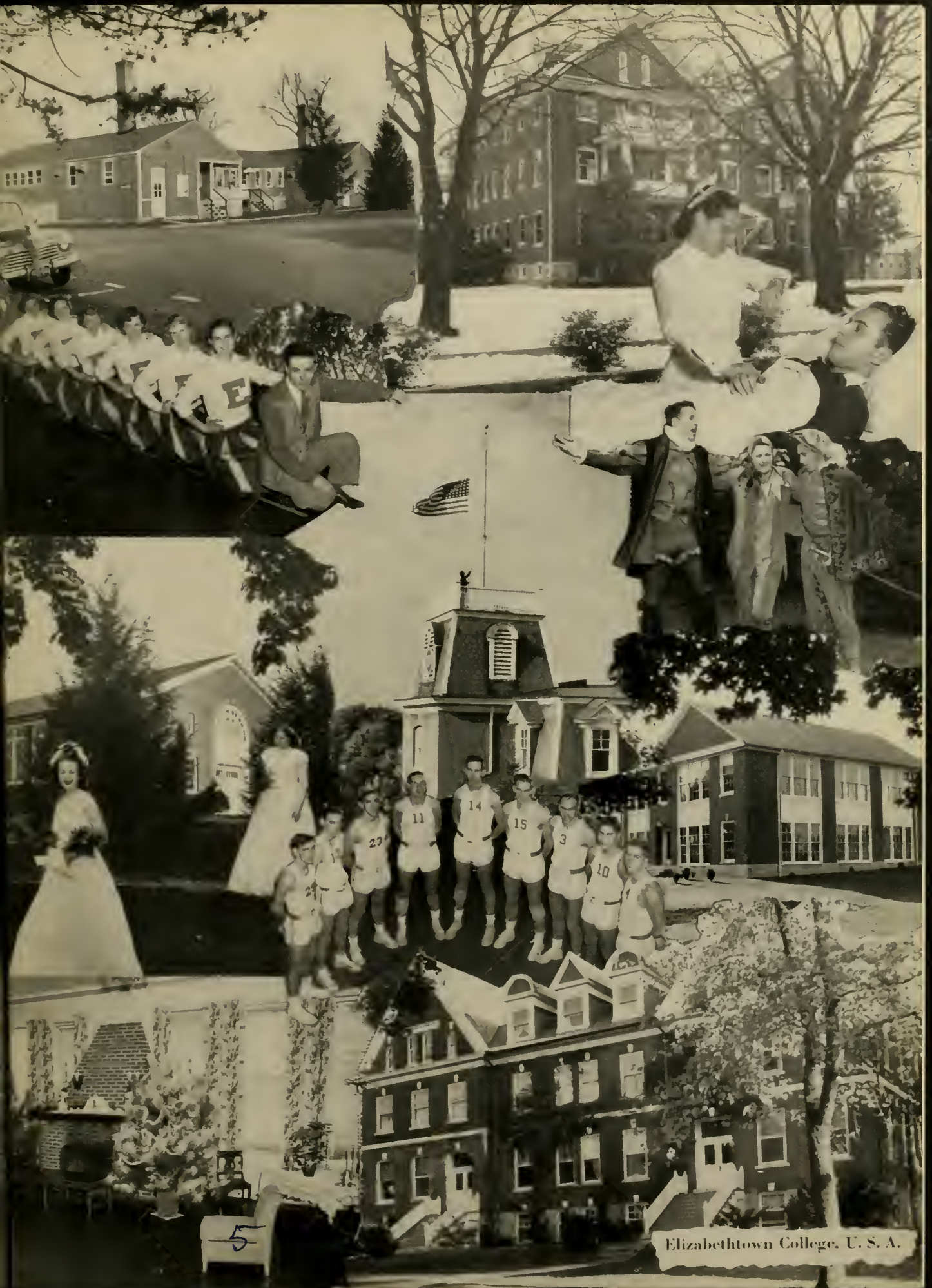

In the classroom students catch his enthusiasm and appreciate the thoroughness of his teaching.





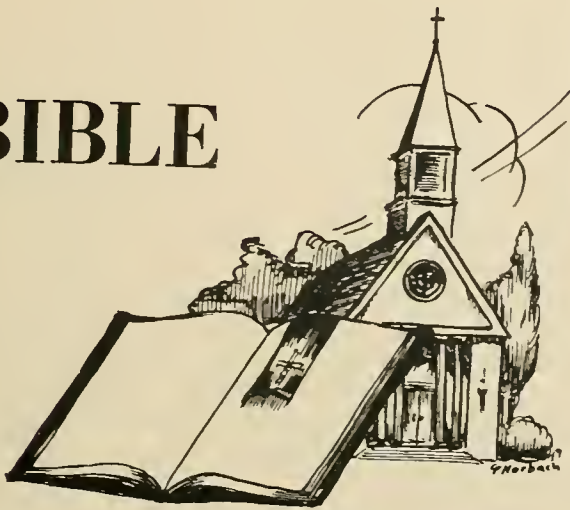

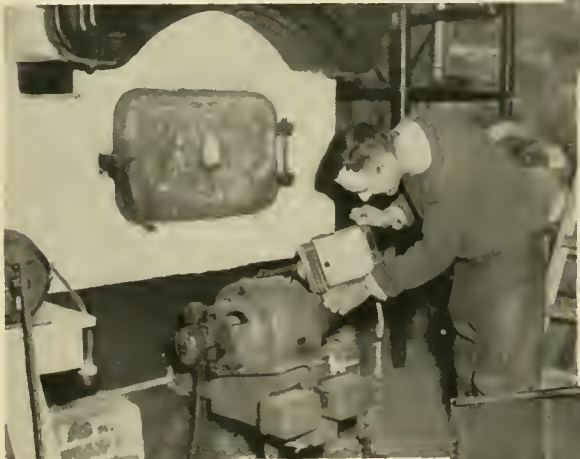

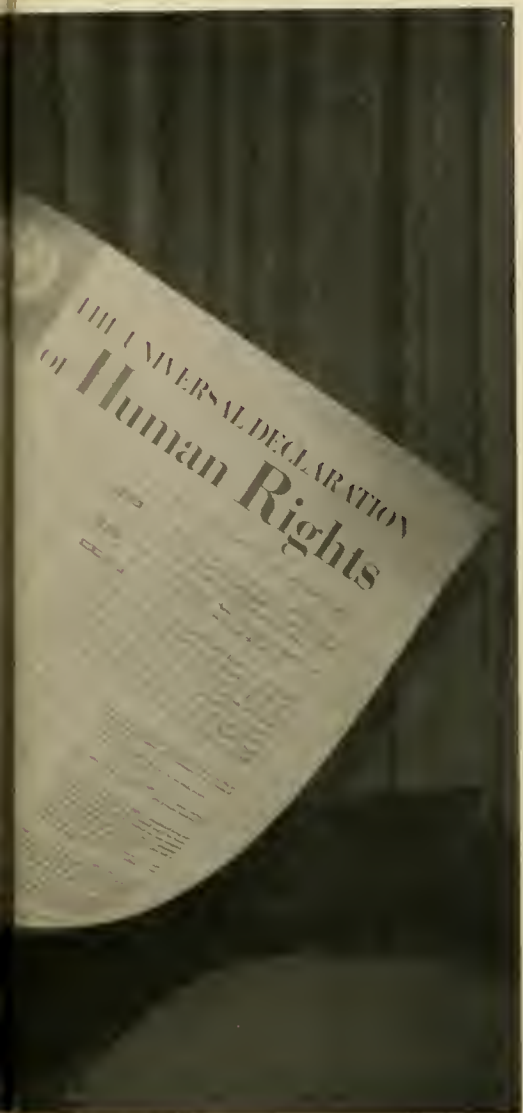
